"Belong, Behave, Believe"

In the early 20th Century, many people were born into their religious traditions. Someone raised in a Catholic household would most likely join a Catholic church in their adult life. A person who belonged to a community of faith would learn how to behave appropriately to fit in with their peers. Eventually, they may come to believe the teachings of the faith.

This way of becoming a part of a faith community began to shift later in the 20th Century after the social revolutions of the 1960's. People began to join organizations based on beliefs. Adults began to leave the churches of their childhood to join other faith communities which fit their belief system. There was a change from belonging to a community for a lifetime and inheriting a construct for beliefs, to having belief shape the choice of a community. Once someone decided to join a church based on belief, they would learn to belong and behave to remain inside the group.

In the early part of the 21st Century why people became a part of organization shifted again. New members became attracted to churches based on behavior and programming. Someone would join a community different from their family of origin and even different from their own personal beliefs, based on the actions and behavior of the community of the church. For example, my cousin in Texas, now almost 50, grew up in our family's Presbyterian church. Later she took her family to a much larger church with vastly different views on faith, but it had great programs. My cousin admitted to not believing everything the church taught, but she enjoyed the church's mission to the larger community with its large food

ministry to the poor and job training for the impoverished surrounding community. My cousin found purpose in the mission of the church. This church grew. It didn't grow because families were having more children the way traditional mainline churches grew in the early 20th Century. It didn't grow because everyone believed the same thing. It grew because people found a way to live out their own beliefs.

Many people still go to the churches they were raised in. Many still find churches based on their beliefs. Many still become a part of faith communities based on what the churches do. But the way *most* people join organizations has flipped. We no longer, "Belong, Behave, and Believe." The church in the 21st is about action! People were attracted to the early church, because they saw lives being changed and the Gospel being lived out. They belonged and believed once they saw how the church behaved. My prayer is that we may live into this way of being God's people.

Stewardship Session Notes - May 13, 2019

TREASURER REPORT:

- 1. Pledges for April were \$18,226.50 and were under budget by \$1,773.50. Other incomes included Loose Plate of \$101.50, Rental Income of \$134.95, Per Capita of \$114.00, Endowment Transfer of \$5,000.00, and Online Giving Fees of (\$54.11). April total revenue was \$23,622.84.
- 2. Expenses for April were under budget by \$8,573.14 and under budget (\$12,501.25) for the year.
- 3. Net income after four months is \$17,281.17.

BALANCE SHEET:

- 1. Checking account balance for March was \$26,447.55 and for April is \$29,308.30.
- 2. The BDB TYD checking account balance is unchanged at \$11,267.58.
- 3. Building accrual account balance is unchanged at \$20,903.14.
- 4. Memorial account balance last month was \$12,513.89 and is currently \$17,084.93.
- 5. Triennium balance is \$4,000.
- 6. Scholarships balance is \$1,527.50.
- **7.** Online Giving Receivables last month was \$2,184.91 and is currently \$3,728.80.

INCOME STATEMENT:

- **A. Income:** General Pledges are over budget by \$7,514.50 for the year. Our net income for the month was \$3,569.62. Our pledge rate in April was (\$1,773.50) under budget.
- **B. Expenses:** For the year, we are (\$12,501.25) under budget. In April our expenses were under budget by \$8,573.14.
- **C. Net Income:** We currently have a net total income of \$17,281.17 year to date vs a budget of \$952.85.

IowaWINs' April Events

We are off to an exciting start for a new lowaWINs project called Nutrimos (We nourish). The goal is to nourish physically, mentally, and spiritually through working and learning together and respecting the dignity of each individual. This project is being led by **Morgan Hoenig** (MOGO Farms and lowa State Extension) and **Annalisa Miller** (leader of lowaWINs activities and outreach in Fairfield). They are both amazing leaders. This project has grown from a glimmer of an idea to a reality due to their knowledge and skills. The project has three components: community gardening, education and training, and the potential of a food truck business start-up this summer.

The community gardening is off to a great start. Thanks to grants from Farm Credit Services and Henry County Master Gardeners, IowaWINs was able to purchase potting soil and seedlings for use in the community gardens. Through a grant application to Herman's Garden Seed Donation, 50 packets of organic heirloom seeds were donated and shipped to the church for the community gardens! **Morgan** donated seedlings and also grew seedlings on her farm for tomatillos and peppers from the donated heirloom seeds. She is also growing onions for IowaWINs on her farm that church members planted during "Giving Back" Sunday in April.

Many of the immigrant families joined with our local foods experts to prepare their plots on the Fellowship Cup Community Garden space and planted seedlings and seeds on a beautiful afternoon on May 15. Some other families gathered seeds to start a garden in their yards at home. IowaWINs also has a couple of plots, so we can grow produce for distribution through the pantry. Our local foods experts include **Barb Stone** (Jefferson County Food Hub Coordinator), **Chuck Albright**, and **Morgan Hoenig**. We are very excited that we will have fresh, locally grown produce for the health of the immigrant families this summer.

The next component is education and training. Six immigrants participated in the Safe Serve training/certification offered in Spanish in Iowa City by ISU Extension. It was a

full day class covering significant requirements for operating a safe kitchen for public food consumption. At the end of the day, the participants took the certification exam and are waiting for their results. Whether they are successful in being certified, they all learned a great deal about safe food handling. Anyone that is certified, can then train others in safe food handling, so the learning will continue to be spread. Other educational/training plans include budgeting, preserving foods, customer service skills, and leadership skills.

We are very pleased to announce that the third component of the project, "Just" Tacos food truck is very close to being kicked off this summer. We have received a \$30,000 grant from Presbyterian Disaster Assistance to help cover the cost of a chef/food truck manager and other startup expenses. We are waiting on a second grant that would cover the cost to buy or lease the food trailer. There actually is a custom-made taco trailer for sale in the local area. Jane Martin, another Fairfield friend, has been researching events and locations for the "Just" Tacos truck to serve. All the pieces are coming together with the help of the Spirit. Volunteers will help staff the food truck and gain valuable experience and skills to help them in seeking employment. We will use local foods to prepare the tacos and the profits will be returned to IowaWINs for continued assistance to the immigrant families, as they wait for immigration hearings and work permits.

Many thanks to **Ed Chabal** and **Barbara Myers Rainbow** who volunteered to oversee the financials of the Nutrimos project. **Ed** will provide advice and guidance on set-up and financial requirements and **Barb** will provide bookkeeping services. **Annalisa Miller** and **Tammy Shull** will be responsible for check writing on our separate Nutrimos account at Community 1st Credit Union.

As we marked the one-year anniversary of the ICE Raid, we are grateful for your support of lowaWINs and the families affected by the ICE Raid. We are thankful for the many beautiful relationships that have been formed and we look with hope to the future for these families.

Sound Appeal Celebrates 45th Anniversary

The 2018-19 season marks the 45th season for the adult bell choir (known as Sound Appeal since 1992) of First Presbyterian Church. The idea of starting a bell choir at First Presbyterian had been in the mind of **Burton Mahle**, the Westminster Choir director and member of the Iowa Wesleyan Music faculty, but **Mahle** lacked a background in bell ringing. IWC sophomore music major, Nancy Johnson, stepped forward. She needed a Responsible Social Involvement Project, a requirement for graduating from IWC. After Pastor Rev. Jerry Roseberry approached several major contributors to the church's memorial fund, bells were ordered in the summer of 1974. In early November, two octaves of Schulmerich handbells (25 bells) arrived and rehearsals began. The original choir included Sarah James, Marge Osier, Burton Mahle, Hannah Volkmann, Janet Mahle, Joel Brown, Betty Geary, and Marilyn Mahle. After two years of directing the choir, **Nancy Johnson** graduated and **Burton Mahle** directed until he "retired" around 1984.

Since that time the choir has been directed by Marj
Thimmesch. Currently 13 ringers play a 5-octave (61 bells)
set of bells and a 5-octave set of choir chimes. Regular
ringers include: Jeff Epperson, Jeff Fager, Robyn
Willham, Jane Creager, Mindy Creager, Sherla Arp,
Bonnie Kremer, Martha Wiley, Marilyn Vincent, Sally
Fager, Adam Creager, Sara Kremer, and Ginnie Swarm.
We rely on a talented pool of substitute ringers: Collin
DePriest, Cheyrl Newland, Char Hinrichs, Sarah Hegar,
Paula Hoenig, Deb Sinclair, and Phil Schroetter.

While Sound Appeal regularly contributes to worship services, it has also done a number of outreaches to the community at large over the years. For example, this past season the choir or subsets of ringers made appearances at the Henry County Courthouse for the Mt. Pleasant Women's Club Festival of Trees, at Silver Palms for the family Christmas dinner, at Park Place for a program of Christmas music, and at IWU for the Lessons and Carols service, as well as entertaining Chapter Original A of PEO, which held

its Christmas meeting in our church. Sound Appeal always enjoys collaborating with Westminster Choir or Soul Notes or inviting other instrumentalists to play with us.

We very much appreciate the support of **Pastor Trey**, **Marlene DePriest** (Westminster Choir director) and our **congregation** for our part in the ministry of First Presbyterian.
