Exciting News: Clergy and Church Renewal Grant

I received a letter earlier this month that said, "Dear Colleague, it is a pleasure to inform you that the Christian Theological Seminary (CTS) has awarded a grant to your congregation for its clergy renewal program. Funding for the 2021 Lilly Endowment Clergy Renewal Programs is provided to CTS by Lilly Endowment Inc...."

It is a very competitive grant application process for clergy and their congregations to experience a time of renewal together and apart. The grant is for the amount of \$30,695! I worked with the Session's input on the grant and with **Jean Thomson** and **Ed Kropa** as the church liaisons.

The grant I proposed is based on Mark 6:34, 39, 44:
"As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them. Then he ordered the disciples to get all the people to sit down in groups on the green grass. So, they sat down in groups....all ate and were filled. Then Jesus sent the disciples away on the boat while he went up the mountain to pray."

The renewal program I proposed for myself, along with the congregation, is based on slowing down like Jesus did in the story of the feeding of the 5,000 and afterwards when he went to pray. The idea came from revisiting the book, *Slow Church* by C. Christopher Smith and John Pattison, after reading about it in *Planning Sabbaticals* by Robert C. Saler. When we slow down and take time to sit together, it creates a space to deepen our connections.

It wasn't a coincidence that one of my elders shared a similar question with me as we dreamed together about the proposal for the church. He asked, "why do you think some of our members are sitting in church every Sunday? What's their story?" I told him, "A-ha! That's the idea behind the sabbatical for the church. Let's slow down and you can find out." Deepening our faith and relationships means taking time to talk to each other instead of just a quick hello. Similarly, sometimes nurturing our faith means talking a long walk alone to go and pray.

For part of my renewal, I will hike a portion of the Appalachian Trail, ride in RAGBRAI, and take a boat trip with my dad. I will also spend time with Hudson exploring regional music and recreational activities.

For the congregation, we will read *Slow Church* by C. Christopher Smith, enjoy some catered meals, special music offerings, guided time for rest, relationships and renewal; it will conclude with an intergenerational trip to Heifer International. The grant will cover all the costs for my travel, the expenses for the church for pulpit supply, pastoral care, catered meals, music, the book and a portion of the intergenerational mission trip. The grant is for next Summer: June-August. Thanks be to God!

2 Thessalonians 3:16

In God's time, our expectations can be expanded and surpassed by God's faithfulness. The 2021 Peace & Global Witness Offering encourages the church of our time to cast off anxiety and fear, discord and division, and embrace our reconciling God's mission to those around the corner and around the world. It is boundless peace God offers. It bursts through the shackles of time and expectation. It quiets the anxiety of each believer by joining us together, as we offer our prayer, Now, may the Lord grant us peace in all times in all ways.
